Amish Tripathi introduces some unique trends of the Indian English fiction in his writing, *Immortals of Meluha*. He focuses on the issues related to the man and woman. He writes about dimensions of man and woman relations, aspirations, physical and psychological needs. His characters, both man and woman, have been taken from the Hindu Mythology in which he observes morality in the warm hardness of the human relations. Therefore, they know how to enjoy life. His major concern lies specifically in the innovation of the education system which brings new energy in the whole social system. Amish Tripathi is a social reformer. His women characters highlight their exploitation, domination and repression in the contemporary society. He purposefully chooses youth for the central theme of his novels.

Shiva meets Sati first time when she goes to temple for offering a *Puja* of lord Bharma. Shiva sees her and makes a remark, "Shiva rose, turned and walked down the steps. Looking at Shiva walking away from him, clearly out of earshot, the Pandit whispered with an admiring smile, for he had recognised his fellow traveler in karma. 'The pleasure was all mine, my karmasaathi' Shiva reached the shoe stall, out on his shoes and offered a coin for the service' (32).

Tripathi tries to uncover that the most important thing in the relationship is love. The love is a strong and positive emotional and mental state which gives satisfaction and pleasure both male and his female partner. It helps not only in improving the relationship, but also it improves entire life of

the individuals. Sati feels passiveness in her life before her contact with Shiva due to her past life. She realises herself in love of Shiva and feels pleasure, happiness in her baren life. It is noticed through changes in both Shiva and Sati everyday life's routines.

Amish Tripathi tries to show that satisfy and security plays an important role in the man and woman relationship. A woman always needs a partner, who secures and defends her from the bad elements, and demands a safe space where she can feel secure and can trust her partner. Tripathi, in *The Immortals of Meluha*, tries to show that when Sati goes to temple for offering a *Puja* Ceremony where a group of bandit makes an attack on her. She draws a sword from her *Angvastram*. Both of them is made a quick glance,

Surprised, and flashed her a quick, admiring smile. Her eyes flashed right back, acknowledging the unexpected yet providential partnership. She whispered under her breath to Krittika, 'Run back into the temple. Stay there till this is over.' Krittika protested. 'But my lady...' 'NOW!' she ordered. Krittika turned and ran up the temple steps. Shiva and the lady stood back to back in a standard defensive-partner position. They covered all the directions of any possible attack. The three attackers charged in. Two more jumped in from behind the trees to join the other three. Shiva raised his sword defensively as the shepherd came up close (35)

Another time, Shiva also protects Sati from a social boycott in the social ceremony. She is not allowed to perform any puja, religious and public ceremonies. If accidently, she touches any men and women, she pollutes them. Another incident happened in Kotdwaar, when there was a yagna ceremony organized by the Governor of Kotdwaar in the honour of Shiva. There any Vikarma did not allow in. Tarak came from the north west of Meluha. He considers himself as a 'Moral Police'. He raises questions in presence of Sati. At that time, Shiva protects Sati from the social disgrace and raises his voice in favor of Sati.

Triapthi tries to explain that the healthy relationships are needed praise, motivation and justification in both sides. It is nesscery to each and every human being. Shiva tries to praise Sati's

It is necessary for their mental and physical satisfaction. Tripathi tries to explorer that male and female both need a good partner so that they can enjoy their life and fulfill their physical and psychological needs. Shiva comes to Meluha from Himalaya to secure his tribe. After then, he tries to settle into the meluha because he attracts towards Sati and he decides to choose her as female partner to fulfillment of their needs.
